Competition in sports have become global in nature. The schools are the spring boards from where the players and atheletics are produced. The study aims to discuss the similarities and differences of inter school sports competition in England and Pakistan.
In some traditional sports like soccer the participation rate in England is quite higher then their Pakistani counter parts.
